Act of War - The Overthrow of the Hawaiian Nation

This hour-long documentary is a provocative look at a historical event of which few Americans are aware. In mid-January, 1893, armed troops from the U.S.S. Boston landed at Honolulu in support of a treasonous coup d'etat against the constitutional sovereign of the Hawaiian Kingdom, Queen Lili'uokalani.

The event was described by U.S. President Grover Cleveland as "an act of war."

He is currently co-host of Voices of Truth, One-On-One With Hawai'is Future, the Koani Foundations weekly television show that airs throughout Hawai'i.

Island Council Representative to the Native Hawaiian Education Council; appointed by the Secretary, US Department of Education. At the Hawai'i State Legislature he has served as in-session Clerk of the Senate Committee on Hawaiian Affairs. He is a student, trainer and facilitator of strategic planning and collaborative leadership for Native Hawaiian Community Based Development.
